Hello Friends,

- Please talk through the images as your child enjoys the craft activity. The emphasis is on love being essential to the healing process and by seeing the wounds there is belief that “Jesus is alive”.
- Love is symbolised by the hearts and these should be placed over the wounds – either stuck on or as a flap.
- There are several hearts that can be cut out and used elsewhere so that your child can ‘pin’ their love around the home (possibly where they think love can provide healing).
- You could draw around your child’s hands if this is preferable to the template. The template is easily replicable to avoid the need to print.
- Consider writing words such as **believe** on the hands and, depending on age, referring to **John 20: 24-29** **“stop doubting and believe”**
- The opening and closing of the hands is symbolic of not believing something until you see it.
